

On Wednesdays, Year 9, 10 & 11 attend a traditional Sports afternoon after lunch. Year 11 & 12 are not required to do sport. They may have other lessons or may seek authority to work at home. Year 7 and 8 participate in regular lessons on Wednesday afternoons including Year 7 Special Religious Education. Year 7 sport is delivered throughout the school 2-week cycle using an Integrated Model. This means it is taught as a subject (sport) and is delivered by PDHPE teachers and identified within the class timetables.

YEAR 7-10 CURRICULUM

The curriculum is the range of subjects and other activities available to students. The days are divided into four periods of 76 minutes, except for Wednesdays. The following allocation is based on a two-week cycle of Week A and Week B. Each subject shows the number of 76-minute periods each year has across the two week cycle.

SCHOOL CONTRIBUTIONS

School Contributions

A statement of fees is shared with families annually, which includes school contributions and subject material costs. The statement of fees is developed based upon the subjects students study at school.

Winmalee High School appreciates all contributions that families are able to make towards subject fees and voluntary contribution fees. We use all fees and contributions to cover costs for specific equipment and enhance resources for students in both mandatory and elective subjects. Our Voluntary Contribution fee also supports a wide range of high-quality, school-wide programs and activities. However, this is voluntary. There is support available for families with school and subject contributions.

The Winmalee High School P&C Levy - (A message from the P&C)

The Winmalee High School P&C (Parents and Citizen's Association) is a small, committed and hardworking team. The P&C raises funds through a voluntary P&C levy for all families. The P&C supports several initiatives which include student and community events, and resources for students.

The P&C understand that not all families can contribute but hope that by distributing a small levy across the school community the P&C can continue its work in supporting the school. So instead of buying that sausage sizzle, volunteering time at a school event, or purchasing an item to support the P&C, through this levy, families can support in a different way which we believe will be more equitable. The Winmalee High P&C continues to be passionate about funding projects for the school to enhance resources and equipment which benefit all students. The levy options are \$5, \$10, or \$15.

School Technology

This is a voluntary contribution that assists in the provision of a range of technologies and technical assistance, to support teaching and learning across the curriculum.

Locker Hire

Students can opt to hire a locker for the year for \$20.00. The key is issued once payment has been made. An additional cost will occur for loss of a key. At the end of the year, the fee for the following year must be paid to retain the same locker.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Whilst our focus is on learning and wellbeing, uniform is important at school, and we wish to work with our families to ensure equality and consistency for all students. Uniform is an important part of safety at school, and it also impacts on our reputation in the wider community. Our school's P&C has also worked closely with the school around the wearing of school uniform.

Uniform can be purchased at the Uniform Shop located at the school. Staff at the shop are happy to assist families with the variety of options available. Students can also choose to source other items of clothing outside of the school; however, these items need to meet the school's dress code. The dress code is reasonable and focuses on students being dressed appropriately for the school environment and being clearly identified as Winmalee High School students.

When students represent the school in various activities, they are required to wear full school uniform and at times formal school uniform, depending on the occasion. Students can borrow blazers from the school for formal events. The school is willing to assist any families with financial support for uniform. We ask that you contact the school so we can find a solution that meets your needs. We are happy to assist wherever possible. The school welcomes any donations of second-hand uniform. We care for and make these second-hand items available to students who may need access to additional uniform items. We thank you for working with us.

POSITIVE EDUCATION

Winmalee High is a Positive Education school. Positive Education is an approach to student learning and wellbeing that is based on scientific research and evidence aiming to create students who function well and flourish in school and in life. The school uses the Psychologist, Martin Seligman's PERMAH model as its framework for implementation of Positive Education which focuses on developing Positive emotions, positive Engagement, positive Relationships, Meaning and Purpose, Accomplishment and Health/wellbeing in our students.

In Year 7, a range of programs, lessons and activities occur to develop students' ability to function well and flourish in school and life.

- Learning and Wellbeing lessons are held once a fortnight (76 mins). Students are taught a range of skills designed to help them to positively engage in learning and develop study skills and ICT skills as needed to support their learning and accomplishment. They explore ways to develop a growth mindset and mental toughness including developing persistence, learning to take on feedback and dealing with setbacks and other aspects of wellbeing.
- Positive relationships and positive emotions are developed through the Rock and Water Program which teaches emotional regulation and skills in and understanding of holding personal boundaries.
- Other activities designed to foster positive relationships, positive emotions and positive engagement are offered to all Year 7 students. These include Peer Support, the Settling into High School Program, Swim School, as well as sports gala days or access as needed to the Learning Hub.
- Opportunities to participate in broader school programs and activities provide for general
 wellbeing and foster meaning, accomplishment, positive engagement, positive emotions and
 positive relationships. These include the Band Program, Vocal Group, Music Tutoring, Dance
 Ensembles, Drama Group, Debating or Public Speaking, Visual Arts competitions, Mathematics
 and Big Science competitions, Taekwondo, Crochet Club and numerous others.

LEARNING AND SUPPORT

Students needing support with their learning are assisted in a number of ways at Winmalee High. The primary methods are the development of Individual Learning Plans (ILPs) and support through the Learning Hub.

Students needing ILPs may be identified by primary schools, teachers or parents. Once identified, plans are developed to explain the nature of the learning difficulty and outline specific strategies to assist a student. The plan is communicated to all teachers and used to guide classroom-based strategies.

In addition, students with ILPs and other students may be supported through the Learning Hub. This is a calm and supportive environment in which students receive help with assessment tasks and class-based work. The Hub also runs targeted programs to address literacy and numeracy needs with small groups of students. Students experiencing anxiety or difficulties with social skills may also be supported through the Learning Hub. The Learning and Support Teacher as well as the Head teacher Wellbeing are available to assist parents and carers of students needing learning support.

POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) at Winmalee High School continues to promote safe, respectful learners. PBL aims to improve social and learning outcomes for students, teachers and the school community. It does this by setting achievable behavioural standards for students and teachers. Problems are identified and explicitly taught to the students encouraging appropriate school and community behaviour.

Winmalee High School provides a safe, secure environment based on respect, trust and support. Students are encouraged to make the most of the opportunities provided to maximise their learning. If students follow the school rules then quality teaching and learning remains the focus at Winmalee High School.

NSW public schools

NSW public schools are committed to providing safe, supportive and responsive learning environments for everyone. We teach and model the behaviours we value in our students.

In NSW public schools students are expected to:

- Respect other students, their teachers and school staff and community members
- Follow school and class rules and follow the directions of their teachers
- Strive for the highest standards in learning
- Respect all members of the school community and show courtesy to all students, teachers and community members
- Resolve conflict respectfully, calmly and fairly
- Comply with the school's uniform policy or dress code
- Attend school every day (unless legally excused)
- Respect all property
- Not be violent or bring weapons, illegal drugs, alcohol or tobacco into our schools
- Not bully, harass, intimidate or discriminate against anyone in our schools

Schools take strong action in response to behaviour that is detrimental to self or others or to the achievement of high quality teaching and learning.

Behaviour Code for Students: Actions

- Care for self and others
- Avoid dangerous behaviour and encourage others to avoid dangerous behaviour

Engagement

- Attend school every day (unless legally excused)
- Arrive at school and class on time
- Be prepared for every lesson
- Actively participate in learning
- Aspire and strive to achieve the highest standards of learning

The principal and school staff, using their professional judgment, are best placed to maintain discipline and provide safe, supportive and responsive learning environments. The department provides a policy framework and resources such as Legal Issues Bulletins, access to specialist advice, and professional learning to guide principals and their staff in exercising their professional judgment. In this context the NSW Government and the Department of Education will back the authority and judgment of principals and school staff at the local level.



SPORTING CODE OF CONDUCT

PURPOSE

At Winmalee High School we value highly the ideals of sportsmanship, determination, school spirit, team play, fairness and respect. Successful teams know how to win with humility and dignity and lose with grace and sportsmanship.

PARTICIPANTS' CODE OF CONDUCT

As a representative of Winmalee High School -

Students are expected to:

- listen to the coach's instructions and play, above all, as a team member rather than as an individual:
- keep comments positive towards opponents and the referee/umpire;
- cooperate with the coach, teammates, referee/umpire and opponents;
- compete within the rules;
- encourage fellow team members by making positive comments;
- control their temper at all times and in all circumstances.

Students should not:

- respond to provocation or poor behaviour by opponents;
- show unsportsmanlike conduct such as swearing, fighting or cheating;
- challenge the referee or umpire.

SPECTATORS' CODE OF CONDUCT

The school welcomes the support of spectators who:

- act as role models of good sportsmanship;
- demonstrate appropriate social behaviour with positive comments to and about members of both teams:
- are courteous to players, coaches and officials;
- encourage and support honest effort and team play with generous applause;
- respect all team players and the decisions made by coaches and umpires/referees;
- support School Sport Australia's policy and the school's policy of a smoke and alcohol-free environment;
- recognise the effort made by volunteer coaches and officials.

GENERAL SCHOOL INFORMATION

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Student financial assistance is available from the school. The cost of course fees, uniform and excursions can be supported by the school. Contact the principal should you require assistance at any time. Requests are dealt with sensitively to support students and families. For those who simply need time to make payments a payment plan can be organised to assist families to systematically pay course costs and contribution fees.

SUPPORTING STUDENTS

Girls' Adviser - The Girls' Adviser role is to support and advise girls on matters such as female issues, personal hygiene, social matters and positive behaviour. They communicate with a range of staff including teachers, year advisers and the school counsellor on student welfare/wellbeing matters. The Girls' Adviser offers advice and support and can lead meetings and workshops to address specific needs of students.

Year Advisers - The Year Advisers support the wellbeing, progress, and attendance of students in their year group. Students and parents/carers can seek the assistance and advice of the Year Adviser.

School Counsellors - The school counsellor's role is to help students with problems that might occur at home, at school or elsewhere. If a student wishes to see the counsellor, they can make an appointment through their year adviser or deputy principal.

Head Teacher Administration - The head teacher Administration monitors student attendance and works with students, staff and families to support regular attendance. The head teacher Administration also works with the Home School Liaison Officer to support students with attendance concerns.

Faculty Head Teachers - Head teachers of Faculties are available to help with issues associated with their subject (English, Mathematics, Science, Human Society and its Environment, Visual Arts, Music, Applied Technology, Industrial Arts, PDHPE and Wellbeing).

Student Leaders - Captains and Prefects are elected to represent the students at the school. The senior Student Leadership Team represent the school at functions and act as ambassadors for our school at community events. They are leaders of the Student Council.

Student Representative Council - The Student Representative Council meets regularly to discuss matters relevant to students. The Council provides or acts as the voice of all students and may advise the principal of student needs, organise school functions and act as a forum for student discussion. Students are elected from each year group to the Council and at times report back on pending issues or seek the opinions of other students.

Learning and Support Teacher - The Learning and Support Teacher (LaST) supports students with specific learning needs or difficulties. The LaST works with parents, students, and teachers to develop individual learning plans. Access to learning support is coordinated through the school's Learning Hub.

School Office - Our office staff will make appointments, accept payments, absence explanations, emails and telephone calls, and manage enquiries from students and parents.

The school office is attended from 8.00am to 3.00pm. The payment of monies including fees are accepted from students before school, recess, and lunch time. Parents are able to pay fees between 8.00am and 1.30pm. Payments can be made in cash or using EFTPOS. Parents and carers may also pay online via the School Bytes payment system. This is accessed via the link on our school website, the School Bytes app, or by following the link provided with all fee contribution statements.

Appointments - Appointments with school staff can be arranged by emailing or calling the school. We will do our best to connect you with the right person.

Peer Support - Our Peer Support program is run in the first week of school to assist Year 7 students in becoming familiar with school routines and making connections with others. Year 10 Peer Support Leaders work with the Peer Support Coordinator to deliver this program.

Study Skills - Skills in organisation and study are developed through programs that operate in Year 7 to Year 12. Year 7 have a Learning and Wellbeing lesson once a fortnight, and they are taught explicit study skills in these lessons. Year 11 students learn study skills as part of their senior orientation program.

ATTENDANCE & PUNCTUALITY

Winmalee High School expects regular attendance and punctuality. These are essential for success in learning, to develop self-discipline and increase employment opportunities.

To help our students achieve their full potential we need teamwork between the student, the school and parents. Therefore, we seek assistance from parents to:

- 1. Expect and encourage your child/ren to attend and to be punctual (by roll call at 8.30am).
- 2. Reply to text messages to explain absences or lateness. Texts are sent each day. The school can also be notified by the Sentral Parent Portal for full day absences, or by phone, email or letter.
- 3. Reply to follow up emails from the school to provide explanations for absences or lateness each week.
- 3. Contact the school as soon as possible to report any ongoing absence so that we can work together to address any issues. The school will support continuity of learning where possible.
- 4. Where possible, arrange appointments at the doctors, dentists, etc., outside school hours. This includes Wednesday afternoons, as Sport is an integral part of the school's curriculum.
- 5. Contact the school if you are going on a holiday during term time, as an exemption form needs to be completed.

ROLLS

Roll Call groups are in a year group system or specialty groups. Each year group has a Year Meeting once a fortnight during roll call with their Year Adviser.

DUTY OF CARE / LEAVING EARLY

Parents/carers are reminded that the school has a duty of care during school hours. This means all arrangements such as leaving early or leaving school grounds must occur through the school's front office, not via their child's mobile phone. Please contact the head teacher Administration for matters of concern about attendance and arrange an interview if necessary. Students can an arrange early leaver's pass by providing their note to student services in the morning.

TRUANCY

Rolls are marked on a lesson-by-lesson basis. Parents/carers will be notified via a phone call if their child is missing from a lesson, and we cannot locate the student. If students are not in their regular timetabled class for any reason, they must communicate with their teachers to ensure they are accounted for and to allow for the roll to be adjusted accordingly. If students miss a lesson, they are expected to catch up on the class work.

The Home School Liaison Officer (HSLO) is a Department of Education employee who works with the school to monitor student attendance. The HSLO may contact parents about attendance matters. Students who do not attend regularly without justification will be referred to the Home School Liaison Officer by the school.

LATENESS (Student arrives after 8.30am)

Students are expected to be at school by 8.30am. Students who arrive late without a note or contact from their parent/carer will need to have late arrivals explained. A text message is sent by the school for all unexplained late arrivals and a reason can be provided with a reply text. 'Sleeping in', or 'the alarm clock did not go off' are not a justifiable reason for lateness.

Students arriving **after roll call** must report to Student Services to sign in so that they can be marked as present for the day. Persistent latecomers are not meeting school expectations around being punctual/on time, nor are they being the best learner they can be. Arriving late disrupts the lesson and does not support students to build positive habits of punctuality. Students are expected to catch up on any missed work due to lateness.

EARLY LEAVERS

Where possible, please try to make appointments outside of school hours. In the event that this is not possible the following applies:

- A student seeking to leave early for such as appointment must have a signed note from a parent/guardian. An email can also be sent. Text messages to the student are not sufficient.
- The note is to be taken by the student to Student Services before Roll Call.
- Student Services will issue an early leaver's pass which the student is to present to their teacher prior to leaving for the appointment. The pass can be picked up at recess or lunch.
- The student is to sign out in the early leaver's book located at Student Services at the time written on the pass.

OUT OF BOUNDS AREAS

- Bush surrounding the playground and at the back of the school
- Staff carparks
- All areas between the eastern boundary and school buildings, e.g. behind the library
- Neighbouring properties
- Bus Bay and retaining wall near bus bay area.

BUILDINGS

Students should not be in the buildings before school, during recess or lunchtime, or after school without the permission of a teacher. The exception will be days on which the weather is extremely cold or rainy. Students will be notified that they can move into the buildings during breaks.

FRONT OFFICE

Students can enter through the doors near the head teacher Administration's office or near the deputy principal's office. Students may need to access the office for:

- Paying money to the office
- Seeking advice or support from the front office staff
- Checking lost property
- Handing in a mobile phone for confiscation
- Being sent on a message or to be collected early
- Attending Sick Bay
- Seeing the principal, deputy principal or head teacher Administration.

PERSONAL PROPERTY

All clothing and equipment (such as calculators) should be labelled or engraved, to show the owner's full name. Money, mobile phones, watches and other valuables should not be left in clothing at P.E. or Sport or in bags that are left outside classrooms. Students can make arrangements with their teacher for security of articles of value.

All lost property found should be handed in at the office to enable the owner to be located. Students can enquire at the front office at recess or lunchtime if they have lost anything.

LOST PROPERTY

Lost property is located at the front office. Students finding lost property are encouraged to act with integrity and hand lost property in to the office. Parents are encouraged to help their child label or mark their clothing or equipment in some way so that it is easily identified and can be returned to the student.

MOBILE PHONES

Mobile phones are banned at school and should be off and away from gate to gate. This includes recess and lunch time, and school events and excursions. If students break the ban and use their mobile phones or related accessories at school, they will be confiscated. Disciplinary consequences apply for repeated failure to follow the mobile phone ban procedures. See our website for more information on procedures and some frequently asked questions.

COMMUNICATION AND STAYING CONNECTED

SENTRAL PARENT PORTAL AND SENTRAL FOR PARENTS APP

Winmalee High School uses the Sentral Parent Portal and Sentral for Parents App.

We encourage you to download the Sentral for Parents App, accessible from the **Apple App Store** or on **Google Play**.

The school will email out a letter which contains your personal Access Key to access your child's information. If your child lives between two households, each individual parent can receive their own Access Key. If there is an additional parent who does need access, they will be able to contact the front office to obtain an additional, separate Access Key.

Within the Sentral for Parents App you will have access to your child's attendance information with the capacity to view and explain absences. You will also be able to view their timetable, school reports, daily notices, excursion notes, assessment tasks, and the school calendar, as well as book parent/teacher interviews.

The app is not required to use the Parent Portal on a computer/phone or tablet. The URL for access to the Portal using a computer/phone/tablet's web browser

SCHOOL NEWSLETTER

The newsletter is emailed to all parents and carers each Friday afternoon. Parents are requested to provide their current email address to assist with electronic distribution of the newsletter. These newsletters are a record of school events and events to come. The newsletter is also published on our website each week.

LETTERS HOME

Letters are sent to inform parents/carers of events to come or seek permission for your child to participate in events. A copy of the excursion notes can be found on the Sentral Parent Portal.

MEETINGS

- P&C meetings are held on the second Wednesday evening of each month, beginning at 6.30pm.
 Meetings are held online and face to face. A strong school needs an active P&C, please consider
 giving your support by attending these meetings, assisting as a volunteer in our canteen or
 supporting consultation for school planning.
- Parent teacher evenings are organised in June for Year 11 and 12, and early Term 3 for Year 7-10.
 Parents are encouraged to meet their child's teachers and discuss their child's progress and ways to support their improvement.
- Open Night has been a feature of the school's activities each year. It is held towards the end of Term 3. All families and friends are welcome.

- Year 7 Meet the Teachers is an informal gathering and BBQ for teachers and parents/carers to meet at the beginning of the school year. This event is held in mid Term 1, after school.
- Presentation Evening is held at the end of the year in Term 4 and Presentation Day assemblies are held for Year 7-11.

STUDENT NOTICES

Student notices are posted daily in Sentral. These are read out during roll call and are also displayed around the school. Students can access Notices through their Sentral portal, and parents can also see notices through the Parent Portal.

EXCURSIONS

Many excursions are organised for various subjects, sports and other activities. Permission notes are shared on the Sentral Parent Portal in addition to students receiving a paper copy. Payment for excursions can be made through the School Bytes app or by paying cash or EFTPOS at the school. It is important that due dates are observed for excursion payments and permissions.

Students with health care needs or an emergency health care plan must bring appropriate medication to all excursions.

EMAILS

Emails are sent regularly to share newsletters, provide specific information about school operations, up and coming events, including Subject Selection evenings and Parent Teacher evenings, to seek parent participation in school activities or to keep you informed.

TEXT MESSAGES

Text messages are sent daily for student absences. Parents/carers can respond directly to the text message to explain the absence.

SCHOOL INTERVIEWS

Bookings for Parent Teacher Interviews are made through the Sentral Parent Portal. Parents/Carers will be notified via email and the Sentral for Parents app when bookings open.

ASSESSMENT AND REPORTING A-E GRADES

All NSW Schools are required to report using a standard referenced system based upon an A-E grading scale. This means there is no limit to the number of A's or B's etc. that can be achieved by students within courses. Students have to demonstrate or work toward achieving the standards. Teachers describe the standard or level of achievement or how well they achieve based upon the A-E this grading scale.

The following descriptors are used to describe **how well** students have achieved what they have learned during that semester. These grades will appear on assessment tasks or assignments and on school reports (biannually).

A: Outstanding - The student has an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved a very high level of competence in the processes and skills and can apply these skills to new situations.

B: High - The student has a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations.

C: Sound - The student has a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills.

D: Basic - The student has a basic knowledge and understanding of the content and has achieved a basic level of competence in the processes and skills.

E: Limited - The student has an elementary knowledge and understanding in few areas of the content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills.

RECOGNITION OF MERIT

Students at Winmalee High School are encouraged to reach their maximum through processes that emphasise positive recognition of quality work and significant achievement. There are four levels of awards beginning with bronze, silver, then gold and the highest level platinum.

Teachers issue commendation letters, commendation postcards and Goldie Merits to students at a class or faculty level. Recognition with Goldies is through weekly raffles for canteen vouchers, and commendation letters and postcards can contribute towards the Winmalee Medal.

Commendations are provided by teachers in such areas that may include:

- special or exceptional effort in class
- improvement in class
- improvement in attitude towards work
- outstanding effort in some aspect of school activity (e.g. debate, sport performance)
- outstanding effort in a class project
- a high place in a class test or exam
- work experience or school service (e.g. library/canteen)
- community service
- representing the school
- best and fairest at sport.

THE WINMALEE MEDAL

The school aims to give high recognition to students who display commitment. We value extensive participation in curricular and extra-curricular activities. The Winmalee Medal recognises students' holistic achievements in a balanced and progressive framework.

To receive an award the student needs to earn eight credits in at least four of the following categories with a maximum of three credits per category. Some activities have a value of two credits. This encourages students to become involved in a variety of areas of school life in any academic year.

The categories include:

- 1. Academic Excellence/ Merit Program
- 2. Leadership
- 3. Community Service
- 4. Creative and Performing Arts
- 5. Sports Representation
- 6. Other

There are five steps in the award:

The first step is the Certificate of Achievement 1 The second step is the Certificate of Achievement 2 The third step is the Certificate of Achievement 3 The fourth step is the Winmalee Medal The final and ultimate Step is the Principal's Medal




Students can complete two Steps per year. They can semesterise their achievements, completing two levels in 12 months, but students cannot double up on the activities within the same year. For example, students cannot count the SRC points twice, unless they decide to split their two points across the year, allocating one per semester, if eligible. Another example may be being a Regional/Zone Sport Representative – students would need to represent in two different fields each semester to count it twice. For example, Zone Athletics, and Zone Swimming could be counted as two separate activities.

The exception to counting an activity each semester, is the Highly Commended (RoSE Breakfast) and the Consistent Effort awards for Semester 1 and Semester 2 academic reports. For Semester 2, students who expect to receive the award can enquire before the release of invites to include this in their final application for the Winmalee Medal that year.

Once students have reached Step 4, they have achieved the Winmalee Medal and are eligible to apply for the Principal's Medal via a Future Leaders Project. Another way students can achieve the Principal's Medal is by achieving the Winmalee Medal twice. Students who achieved the Winmalee Medal twice (two full cycles), will automatically achieve the Principal's Medal.

LIBRARY

The Winmalee High School library promotes a supportive, effective, and enjoyable information environment for the school community. The library provides physical and digital resources and the expertise of the teacher librarian to support the curriculum, guide students' research and promote a joy and love for recreational reading.

Teacher librarians provide students with opportunities to develop information skills and to use these skills competently and with confidence for lifelong learning.

Library Hours Monday - Friday

Seniors: 8.15am- 3.00pm (extended hours can be negotiated if required)

Juniors: 8.30am- 2.45pm

The library is open during recess and lunch under the supervision of the teacher librarian. Students may engage in quiet recreational reading and activities or use computers to complete class and assessment tasks.

Borrowing

Seniors: Fiction – four resources **Juniors:** Fiction – two resources

Non-fiction: eight resources

Non-fiction: four resources

Please note that library hours and the number of resources borrowed is flexible to cater for individual student needs at the discretion of the teacher librarian.

Students can also borrow games through the library.

Use of printer/photocopier

There is a printer/photocopier which is available to students in the library. Students can print from the library during recess and lunchtimes. There are three computers connected for printing in the library. There is no cost for students for printing their work or assessments.

SPORT

The school is divided into four houses for swimming, cross country and athletics carnivals. The houses are:

Hawkesbury A - E - Red
 Blue Gum F - L - Blue
 Sassafras M - R - Green
 Yellow Rock S - Z - Yellow

The houses are named after prominent local geographical features.

Year 7 & 8

All students participate in two periods of Integrated Sport weekly. This is in addition to two periods of Physical Education and one period of health. These programs are usually delivered by Personal Development, Health & Physical Education Teachers.

Students are required to wear normal uniform to school and change into sports uniform at the beginning of practical PE/Sport lessons.

Carnivals

This is a school day and all students are expected to attend school carnivals. Students not participating in events are encouraged to support other students who are competing for their house. The school holds Swimming, Cross Country and Athletics Carnivals each year.

Wednesday Sport (Year 9 - 10 only)

Students are encouraged to participate in a variety of sports - both grade and recreational.

Students who are unable to participate in sport on a particular afternoon must bring a note of explanation to Student Services before roll call. All students will be allocated to a sport group and are expected to attend every week. Students who forget their money or equipment (and are unable to arrange a loan) or miss their sport bus, must report to non-sport supervision.

Students are expected to wear the sports uniform for their sports. Students not in correct uniform may be prevented from leaving the school for sport. In summer, hats and sunscreen are recommended as protection against the sun.

Students are not permitted to ride bicycles or drive vehicles (seniors) to their sport venue.

The cost for sport buses is invoiced to families each term. Venue fees are paid by students directly to the venue each week.

Wet Weather

Indoor sports will still continue where practicable, all other students will be assigned to groups and supervised by a roster of sports teachers in classrooms for the afternoon.

Zone Teams

Representative teams are entered in a range of sports which can include: Athletics, Australian Rules Football, Baseball, Basketball, Cross Country, Cricket, Diving, Euroball, Golf, Gymnastics, Hockey, Lawn Bowls, Netball, Rugby League, Rugby Union, Soccer, Softball, Squash, Swimming, Tennis, Touch, Trampolining and Tumbling, Volleyball and Water Polo.

CHS (Combined High Schools) Knockouts

The school enters these competitions each year depending on the current interest and abilities of students.


