

HLT33021 Certificate III in Allied Health Assistance

Why Should I Enrol?

NSW Health RTO offers Year 11 and 12 students the opportunity to complete Vocational Education and Training (VET) qualifications along with their HSC. Under the Human Services Curriculum Framework, students will be able to complete studies in Allied Health Assistance as part of their HSC.

The Course Can:

- Allow you to obtain a nationally recognised Certificate III in Allied Health Assistance qualification.
- Contribute 2 accredited units towards your Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR).
- Allow the results from the optional Human Services HSC examination to count towards your Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR).
- Provide a qualification for employment in the health industry when you finish school.
- Provide a pathway to further education and training to develop your career in health.
- Offer on-the-job training and experience.
- Support students to gain skills in areas such as safe work practices, infection control, communication, client care, service delivery, duty of care, ethical practice and problem solving.
- Enable students to learn through a combination of theory and practical work.
- Support students to undertake work placement in a range of health facilities in the Sydney Local Health District.

Target Audience

Students enrolled in Year 11 at school in 2025.

Support Provided to Participants

Participants are provided with relevant resources and learning support to complete this qualification.

Course Pathways

- The Certificate III in Allied Health Assistance is a nationally recognised qualification.
- Once completed, you can apply for recognition and credit transfer in other relevant qualifications, including higher level VET qualifications.
- If you are planning to complete further study after the HSC, qualifying and working as an Allied Health Assistant can help you pay your way.
- This qualification allows you to work as an Allied Health Assistant.

Application Process

- Be currently enrolled in Year 10 at school.
- You will need to speak to your school careers advisor who will need to:
 - * Place your application details onto the Department of Education EVET database.
- You will be required to attend an interview and an LLN assessment with the Sydney Local Health District.

Note: Applications cannot be accepted unless your details are entered on the EVET database.

Commencement Details for 2025 Cohort

The program commences in the first week of Term 1, 2025.

Duration of the Course

You must attend one afternoon per week during school in years 11 and 12. You are required to complete 120 hours of work placement during school holidays.
