- SOMETHING FOR SCHOOL Exercise book, pencil case, pencils, colour pencils, textas, sharpener and eraser, book to read
- SOMETHING SPECIAL Carry bag, sunglasses, bracelets, jewelry, craft kit, Christmas decoration, stickers, hair accessories
- AND FINALLY.... A PERSONAL NOTE Christmas card or post card from your hometown or area, the note can be as simple as "Happy Christmas from a friend in Australia"
