Dear Parents and Carers,



lead character/s they would like to audition for and take the music to learn. Auditions will take place December 1 & 2. We are looking forward to seeing a big cast selected for this show!


Thank you, Mr Joseph, for taking **7B Science** to the **Australian Museum** this week. We just love this photo! Well done to all students who attended..
