

Year 7 Swim School – despite the constant changes in the weather and the chill in the fresh mountains air, students and staff made it through another successful swim school. During the week, Year 7 students learnt important lifesaving skills for water safety, supported by trained teachers, as well as our Year 10 PASS students.



This is an important program at our school. Every year since 1995, Royal Life Saving produces a National Drowning Report. This report examines the factors that contribute to drowning deaths in Australia. The statistics are alarming, and this drives us to ensure that we do what we can as a school to keep costs down so we can support students to participate. We would like to thank Mr Dutton for successfully applying for additional funding from the department's Sport Unit, which meant that along with

school subsidies, we were able to significantly reduce the cost this year.

Thank you to students who committed to attending swim school this year. Thank you also to school staff involved, and to **Year 10 PASS students** for their instruction and leadership.



Today, **Year 11 Music 1 and Music 2** students, along with their teachers, Mr McGown, Mrs Clifford and Ms Cooper, led a **Meet the Composer** session. This was a live Zoom session during class time. Students have been studying composer Alex Manton, and her piece, *Adventure to Empress Falls*. Our Music students have been studying score reading and score analysis using Manton's composition, and they prepared specific questions around the concepts of music, which Alex answered during the session. This opportunity supports our students to further deepen their knowledge of the concepts of Music, as well as support them in the development of their mandatory compositional work as part of their HSC assessment. Below is a snapshot of this real-world experience which connects directly to the syllabus and student assessment.



Mobile phone survey and webinar – thank you to those parents and carers who completed the survey late last term. We have been looking at an evening to host a webinar, but it has been challenging finding a space in the calendar with many events on. For this reason, we will share a pre-recorded webinar with families about Mobile Phones in the classroom. The purpose of the webinar will be to share your feedback, current research about the impact of mobile phones on learning and our procedures for managing the use of phones during class time next year. We will include this in our communication within the next fortnight.
