Dear Parents and carers,

School canteen - A reminder that the canteen will not be operational from next week. The week will be spent emptying the canteen in preparation for the refurbishment which will commence in the school holidays. Mrs Shead and Year 12 will run a couple of BBQs next week, and some food will be sold out of the school café area at recess at lunch. The canteen will not be fully up and running until Week 4 next term. But we will have a fantastic, professional hospitality space which will serve our school and students splendidly. The student leaders have outlined a plan, which will be implemented next term. This will include education, communication, support for students and feedback to students, staff and the community about survey data. Part of the survey for female students included feedback on locations to have sanitary napkin dispensers.
