## How to view your child's report on a computer

- Go to https://winmaleehs.sentral.com.au/portal
- Log in using your email address and password
- Once logged into the main dashboard click on your child's name
- on the top left corner
- Click on Academic Reports at the bottom of the menu on the righthand side and you will see the latest report
- You will be able to download the report, save and/or print as required
