


**Bodhi Carlson Year 7** is currently in Fiji playing for the Wanderers Australia U13's AFL team against the Fiji Talent Squad.

#### In the news: Vicki Benn, ex-English Teacher WHS, Blue Mountains Gazette Wednesday 4 December



As a former high school English teacher, **Vicki Benn** helped countless students discover the joy of novels. Now the Wentworth Falls resident is sharing her own novel with the world.

Billed as "the story of a modern Australian family on the brink of revelations that will test the bonds that tie them", *The Dinner Party* has struck a chord with readers since it was released in 2024.

Drawing praise for its relatable setting and characters, Ms Benn said she always hoped readers would identify with her fictional creations.

"None of the characters or situations are directly based on real people or situations, although I think every writer would say they draw from their own

experience. It's inevitable," she said.

"I did want to make the characters and their relationships recognisable. The book is a family drama, and I hope people will see some resonances with their own families, good and bad."

Ms Benn said her decades as a high school teacher inevitably influenced her decision to embark on the novel - and the final work.

"I worked at Winmalee High School for about 20 years, and I'm sure that experience helped in terms of being able to analyse writing and structure," she said.

"Many of my fabulous students were an inspiration in their enthusiasm and willingness to try things in their own writing."

Reaction to the novel has been positive with many readers commenting on its relatability.

"It has been humbling to have so much positive feedback for the book, and it's very exciting seeing it on shelves," said Ms Benn.

"People have commented that the characters are convincing and enjoyable to read, so that's reassuring. It feels like the start of the book's journey. You just never know where it will all take you."

#### **UNSW Bridging Courses**

Bridging courses offer you the opportunity to revise or strengthen your knowledge of HSC Physics, Chemistry or Mathematics so you can successfully manage your studies in year one of university. Your lecturer or tutor will reasonably expect this assumed knowledge at the beginning of your studies. Undertaking the bridging course will ensure you're not at a disadvantage if you do not have a strong background or any prior knowledge in one or more of these HSC subjects and intend on studying a degree that assumes knowledge of these subjects.

#### **Tertiary Preparation Certificate (TPC)**

The Certificate IV in Tertiary Preparation, otherwise known as the Tertiary Preparation Certificate (TPC), is a qualification equivalent to Year 12. It is an excellent alternative if you missed out on the HSC or you want to do the HSC again to achieve a higher score for entrance into university.

TPC graduates gain an Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank (ATAR) equivalent called a Tertiary Entrance Score and can use this to apply for entry to universities across Australia.
